

LOAN ORDER  
Water System Improvements


ORDERED, that \$4,850,000 is appropriated for the purpose of financing planning, design and construction of Phase 14 of the City's Water Project including without limitation all costs thereof as defined in Section 1 of Chapter 29C of the General Laws; and to meet this appropriation the Treasurer, with the approval of the Mayor, is authorized to borrow \$4,850,000 and to issue bonds or notes therefore under Chapter 44 of the General Laws and/or Chapter 29C of the General Laws or any other enabling authority; that such bonds or notes shall be general obligations of the City unless the Treasurer, with the approval of the Mayor, determines that they should be issued as limited obligations and may be secured by local system revenues as defined in Section 1 of Chapter 29C; that the Treasurer, with the approval of the Mayor, is authorized to borrow all or a portion of such amount from the Massachusetts Water Pollution Abatement Trust ("Trust") established pursuant to Chapter 29C and in connection therewith to enter into a loan agreement and/or a security agreement with the Trust and otherwise to contract with the Trust and the Department of Environmental Protection ("Department") with respect to such loan and for any federal or state aid available for the project or for the financing thereof; and that the Mayor is authorized to enter into a project regulatory agreement with the Department, to expend all funds available for the project and to take any other action necessary to carry out the project.

ORDERED, that the Treasurer is authorized to file an application with the appropriate officials of The Commonwealth of Massachusetts (the "Commonwealth") to qualify under Chapter 44A of the General Laws any and all bonds of the City to be issued pursuant to this Order, and to provide such information and execute such documents as such officials of the Commonwealth may require.


Please find attached the proposed Loan Order for Phase 14 of the Water Improvement Projects. Supporting documents on the debt cost, rate impact and specific project scope of work have been attached as well. These improvements are identified in the Master Plan.

I am respectfully requesting that this Phase 14 loan be approved.

The grant funding and subsidized loans for several of the projects require that the loan order be approved prior to June 30, 2014. Failure to achieve said approval can result in the loss of grant and loan subsidy funds.

The debt projections indicate no effect on the water rate for 2014; less than half a penny on the rate for 2015 and 2016 and ten cents on the rate in 2017.





**Comments:**

Per our recent conversation, I am forwarding an overview of current trench repair efforts.

With regards to public utilities, the major excavator in the city is the New England Gas Company (NEGC). Most of their excavations into city streets are due to gas leaks and are thus unpreventable. NEGC currently has several locations that need attention. The engineering department maintains a list of all excavations done by NEGC and is working with them to get these resolved.

NEGC was recently purchased by Liberty Utilities. We have met with their personnel at our office and determined that they have subcontracted permanent trench repair to a local firm, Century Paving and Construction Corp. This firm had the same contract with the previous owners of NEGC and we have found their work to be very good and in accordance with the city guidelines. That said, it does not relieve NEGC from making sure Century is on the job and is working toward the backlog they have.

I have called the asphalt plants that typically supply hot mix to local contractors and found that two opened the first week of April, one opened the second we of April, and one opened the third week of April. We have contacted NEGC and told them that now that the plants are open and proper repairs are possible, we expect Century to be on the job. Our street inspector will be checking to determine if the contractor is present, and will also check repairs as they are accomplished. As always, we will continue to notify NEGC of any gas trenches found not to be acceptable. Under state regulations, NEGC is responsible for trenches forever, so any trenches we find or that are reported to us are still their responsibility.

The engineering department also issues street opening permits to private contractors. These are typically the result of leaks in sewer services or water services. Under city regulations, homeowners are responsible for services between the city main and their home. Therefore, when breaks in pipes occur, they must hire private contractors to do the repair. These contractors are responsible for trench repairs and have a two year obligation to maintain any trenches excavated within city streets.

Private contractors must be licensed by the City Council. The license season runs from May 1 of one year through April 30 of the following year. Applications for next year are now being received and forwarded to the Law Department for bond review and to the City Council for approval. Prior to notifying all existing drainlayers of the license renewal application requirement, the engineering department inspected all trenches done over the previous two years. Any trenches we felt were unacceptable were reported to individual drainlayers. They have been notified that no permits will be issued after May 1 until all their delinquent trenches are repaired.

In the case of several high usage streets, trenches are required to use controlled density fill (flowable fill) for backfill. In February, at the request of the City Council, I submitted to the Council a proposed ordinance requiring that all cross trenches be required to use controlled density fill. I also submitted proposed ordinance dealing with the prevention of utility extensions during the winter months.

In addition to the gas company and private contractors, the Fall River Water Department also does numerous street excavations. These are often the result of water main breaks that require excavation to repair. In recent years, there has been a private contract issued by the water department to conduct trench and sidewalk repairs. In talking with Terry Sullivan of the Department of Public Utilities, I found that he is again requesting funds for trench repair in the FY15 budget. He has also requested funding for using controlled density fill in more excavations. The water department also has on order a new truck with a heated box so that asphalt repairs can be done during a longer period of the year.

Another problem with city streets is potholes. These appear where there is a weak gravel base or subgrade beneath the pavement. Potholes start as small holes in the top layer of pavement and progress downward into lower layers and into the subgrade. They are caused by water being introduced beneath the pavement, followed by traffic loading that causes pavement disintegration due to the poor strength of the pavement subgrade. For localized potholes, the city uses a specialized vehicle for the restoration of the street. In larger cases, a section of roadway needs to be removed and new pavement added. In severe cases where numerous potholes exist, along with other forms of pavement distress, street length full depth reclamation is often advised.

The city DPW currently tracks pothole complaints and works to repair potholes. With the warmer weather now present, these efforts will be able to be increased. Going forward we will coordinate pothole issues reported to the DPW or reported as claims to the law department. These locations will be inspected to determine if any of these are located in trenches that have contractor responsibility.

The City has recently been notified that, due to this year's unusually severe winter, the governor has granted funds to municipalities for the repair of potholes. Fall River will be receiving \$285,375.00. We have been compiling a list of locations that would qualify for these funds and Ken Pacheco and I are currently writing the specifications for the work. The locations need to be approved by MassDOT and then they will reimburse the City for the work. The receipt of these funds will not only enable the city to address numerous high intensity pothole areas, but will also free up our own forces to address some of the less onerous locations.

Also, with regards to potholes, we have received a list of claims that have been made by residents for damage to vehicles. We will be inspecting all these locations and determine if they have been repaired, or if not, whether they should be done by city forces or through the new pothole repair contract. We have arranged for the law department to now forward us claims so this can be done on an ongoing basis.



Dear Mayor Flanagan,

My name is Barbara Stollo. I have lived at 481 Hyacinth St. since 2005. There has been a few on-going issues on my street prior to my moving here, however I did not have any knowledge of the following serious issues.

I have spoken to Terry Sullivan, Charlie Boulay and Councilor Liinda Pereira numerous times. I have also contacted Councilor Ray Mitchell today.

There is a problem with the storm drains. They cannot handle the volume of water and debris during a storm. Water backs up into the street overflowing into the neighborhood yards. There is a health issue because of the debris in the sewer (toilet paper), also the last storm we had was so severe that a vehicle stalled attempting to drive through the water.. A tow truck was called but could not rescue the vehicle. Eventually the street was closed per Police Dept. I also want to mention this is a heavy traveled road because of both schools (Diman and Silvia).

Last year my grandson had to be dropped off at the top of the street because my friend would not attempt driving through the water. This year my neighbor had an appointment but was unable to leave his driveway. If there was a real emergency we would not be able to leave our houses, also an ambulance would not be able to get through.

I have taken many pictures over the years. This as been not only a nuisance, but a serious problem. I understand some areas flood during rain storms, however we are getting the brunt of it. My yard has been destroyed because of dirty water from the street overflowing into my front yard up to the front porch. The first year we moved we paid to have our yard hydro seeded. One rain storm washed all of the loom and hydro seed into the street because the water backup up flooded the street then worked it's way to my front porch.

I have to mention this is not Stafford Square, this is a very desirable neighborhood.

Officials know this has been an on-going problem for years. Ken Pacheco lives on this street but is not affected by it, just the five housed at the bottom of the street which connects to New Boston Rd.

I also would like to mention that every school day Diman buses (13) drive down our street, take a left onto New Boston Rd which blocks traffic. This is very irritating knowing that they used to drive up Locust St.to Eastern Ave. The reason why I bring this up is because when the street is flooded, they drive through which brings the water up to my front porch and my neighbors driveways. One year I called City Hall to request the buses not drive down our street because the water was too high.

Ann O'Neil told me that Councilors voted against raising the water and sewer rates that we would need to address our concerns at the next City Councilors meeting. I feel this problem in my


neighborhood we are experiencing should not be connected with water and sewer fees. This problem has been ignored for a very long time.

In response to a request from Fall River Assistant City Clerk, MassDEP is providing this cover letter for the follow-up information provided relative to the Fall River City Council Health and Environmental Committee meeting held on April 7, 2014.

There have been many questions recently posed by residents, public officials and the press regarding the impending Fall River Landfill closure and the implications for an area of off-site solid waste. On March 10, 2014, MassDEP attended a meeting at Bristol Community College in an effort to answer these questions and move the resolution of these matters forward. On April 7, 2014, MassDEP met with the Fall River City Council Health and Environmental Committee and other city officials and provided a presentation entitled: "Landfill Assessment and Closure Process, Fall River Landfill, 1080 Airport Rd., Old Fall River, MA", which included background information on the Fall River landfill, a general overview of MassDEP's landfill assessment and closure process, and a discussion regarding how the off-site solid waste would be addressed.

At the conclusion of the meeting, MassDEP provided copies of historical aerial photos related to the Fall River landfill located at 1080 Airport Road to the City of Fall River Health and Environmental Affairs Committee. The aerial photos were provided to MassDEP by Browning Ferris Industries on March 27, 2014. Additionally, MassDEP provided the committee with two compact discs containing two reports. One disc included a copy of the Supplemental Comprehensive Site Assessment report from July 2006 that was prepared by Brown & Caldwell for Browning-Ferris. The second disc included a report entitled "Final Report Third-Party

Review, Browning-Ferris Industries (BFI) Fall River landfill" that was prepared for MassDEP by Parsons Corporation in September 2009.

The Walter Furman Company, 180 Liberty Street, is attempting to get Liberty Street from Center Street 261.4 feet north discontinued. They are taking this inexpensive action to avoid our local Zoning Ordinance by laws 86-2 and 86-201,(b), (3) and to avoid purchasing more land. Presently, employees, guest and visitors are illegally parking their vehicles on the east side of Liberty Street in front of their existing building and their proposed building.

86-2, Parking space, off-street, is clear,"Required off-street parking for three or more automobiles **shall** have individual spaces marked and **shall** be so designed, maintained and regulated that no maneuvering incidental to parking **shall** be on any public or private street or walk and so that any automobile may be parked or unparked without moving another". 86-201, echos 86-2.

On the west side of Liberty Street, Furmans purchased land last year in (2013) and employees are parking on the land they purchased. However, because the land they purchased on the west side of Liberty Street drops off so sharply, only one row of vehicles can park there. Before they purchased the land on the west side of Liberty Street employees were illegally parking on the west side of Liberty. However, because they purchased the land on the west side of Liberty, those employees parking on the west side became legal off street parking spaces according to 86-2 and 86-201. Thats why they purchased the land on the west side of Liberty, to provide legal off street parking spaces.

Going back to the east side of Liberty Street, there is nowhere on their property they can create legal off street parking places according to 86-2 and 86-201, as they did on the west side of Liberty Street. That is why they want to discontinue Liberty Street from Center Street 261.4 feet north. By discontinuing that area of Liberty Street, it is no longer a Public or Private way subject to the requirements of 86-2 and 86-201.

To proceed according to their plan and a variance they received on January 17, 2013( which has expired), they need 59 off street parking places and that doesn't include provisions for handi-capped parking. The latest ADA standards require all new construction to provide the required handi-capped parking.

The city has no liability or maintainence requirements in that area of Liberty Street. Discontinuing Liberty Street in that area would isolate Liberty Street from Center Street, it would eliminate the Center Street/Liberty Street intersection, it would lock out land owners and prospective land owners in that industrial zoned area from developing access to Liberty Street, it would have a negative effect. Without provisions for drainage it would exacerbate flooding to the homes on lower Sprague Street near Bay Street. Residents walk and children play in that area of Liberty Street when the Furman plant closes in the evening. The Furman Company needs to purchase more land south of Center Street like they did on the west side of Liberty Street to accomodate the off street parking they need, not try to discontinue Liberty Street, a way in an industrial area. Unfortunately, they didn' t purchase enough land to meet their needs last year.

The Furman Company plan is presently trying to put ten pounds in a five pound bag. They don't have the required off street parking nor can they get it without purchasing more land. Attempting to discontinue Liberty Street is merely an inexpensive route they have chosen to provide parking spaces. However, it will not work. Furthermore, they don't have provisions to receive more than one truck of lumber or material at a time in their South Beacon Street receiving area and to prove it they constructed an illegal driveway in the same area they propose to build a 24,000 square foot addition. I complained to Byron Holmes, however, its been over a year and I never received a response to my complaint, although 66-64 states I am entitled to notice.

We urge the city Council to reject the dicontinuing of Liberty Street and have the Furman Company purchase the land they need, there is enough undeveloped land in that area. I have enclosed copies of the Furman plan, variance, 86-2, 86-201,.



In the matter of New 180 Liberty Street LLC for a Variance request to construct an addition to the existing industrial building waiving dimensional requirements in an Industrial District [IND]. Lot sizes 40,440 +/- s.f. and 25,000 +/- s.f.

In a vote of 5-0 the Board voted to grant the petitioner's request with the conditions being that: 1. There shall be a 6' fence with privacy slats erected from the southeast corner of the property northerly for 100' to the northeast corner of the proposed addition. 2. There shall be a minimum of 59 off-street parking spaces. 3. There shall be no parking of commercial vehicles on South Beacon Street. 4. Employees shall not park on Liberty Street from Sprague Street southerly for 112' to the Industrial District line nor shall employees park on South Beacon Street. 5. Certificate of Occupancy shall not be issued until the existing garage is razed. Mr. Frank, Mr. Alves, Mr. Martin, Mrs. Merolla-Simister and Mr. Assad voted in favor of the motion and the petition was granted with conditions.

The Board found that owing to the circumstances relating to the existing parcel, especially affecting the locus but not affecting the Industrial District in which it is located, a literal enforcement of the zoning ordinance would involve substantial hardship to the petitioner and that if relief were not granted, the petitioner would be denied reasonable use of the property. The Board found that the relief requested may be granted, as it would not be detrimental to the neighborhood nor would it derogate from the intent and purpose of the zoning ordinance.

This decision must be recorded at the Registry of Deeds and Rights Authorized by this Decision shall be exercised within **one year of the grant**, otherwise said rights shall lapse

**Sec. 86-201. - IND industrial district.**

- (a) Uses. In an IND industrial district, no structure or land shall be used except for one or more of the following uses:
- (1) Buildings and structures may be constructed, altered, enlarged or reconstructed and used and land may be used for manufacturing, assembling, packaging, industrial research and development, biotechnology, processing, fabrication, warehousing, wholesaling, trucking, including terminal facilities and uses customarily accessory to such uses.
  - (2) Existing mill buildings in existence prior to 1950 may be altered, reconstructed and used for:
    - a. Office of any kind including medical office;
    - b. Retail store or outlet;
    - c. Bank or other financial institution;
    - d. Restaurant or other eating place; and
    - e. Uses customarily accessory to such uses.
    - f. Art use, visual and performing art space, culinary art, retail sales of art, including gift and specialty shops, except adult use as defined in section 86-81 is prohibited.
- (b) Additional requirements, as follows:
- (1) Dust, smoke, fumes, gas, glare, noxious odors, noise and vibrations shall be limited so as not to be injurious to the public health or to the use of neighboring property as provided by the laws of the commonwealth.
  - (2) All buildings and outdoor storage or work areas shall be set back at least 20 feet from any street line and property line.
  - (3) Adequate provision shall be made for the off-street accommodation of all vehicles, including those of employers, employees, customers and visitors.
  - (4) Flashing, moving or intermittent illumination of buildings or signs shall not be permitted.
  - (5) Off-site signs are permitted, subject to the provisions of section 86-252
  - (6) In an industrial district (IND), the following regulations shall apply:
    - a. Minimum lot frontage: 100 feet.
    - b. Minimum lot area: 10,000 square feet.
  - (7) Body art establishments shall be permitted by special permit subject to the provisions of section 86-72
  - (8) No gravel pit, concrete or asphalt plant shall be permitted, except that in a specific case, the board of appeals may, after a public hearing, grant a special permit for the construction or operation of such use, provided the board finds that the location, setback and design of such use will not be detrimental to the neighborhood by reason of traffic, noise, dust or appearance.

other automobile accessories and supplies may be dispensed at retail and where normal services to automobiles may be performed. Uses permissible at a filling station do not include major mechanical and body work, straightening of body parts, painting, welding, storage of automobiles not in operating condition, or other work involving noise, glare, fumes, smoke or other characteristics to an extent greater than normally found in filling stations.

*Frontage* means the dimensions of a lot measured at one street line bounding the lot. For lots located on a cul-de-sac only, such dimension shall be not less than 75 percent of the required width of a lot in any zoning district. Otherwise, minimum lot frontages shall be equal to or greater than the minimum required lot width.

*Garage, private*, means a building, separate or attached to a dwelling, in which one or more motor vehicles but no greater than three, one of which is owned by the owner or a tenant of the premises, are kept solely for the private or professional use of their owners, and in which no space is rented or used for any commercial vehicle with the exception of pickup trucks of less than one ton capacity.

*Lot* means a parcel of land in one ownership which may be occupied by a building, including such open spaces as may be required by this chapter, which is at least of sufficient size to meet the minimum requirements of the district in which it is located. Such lot shall have frontage on any improved public way constructed (or adequately bonded to be constructed) to the city's specifications, or on an improved private way constructed to the city's specifications. (See also *Unbuildable lot*.) The word "lot" includes the words "plot" and "parcel."

*Mill outlet* means an industrial or mill building which has been converted to commercial use.

ARTICLE I 86-2 DEFINITIONS

*Parking space, off-street*, means an area of land adequate for parking an automobile with room for opening doors on both sides together with maneuvering room and proper access to a public or private way. Required off-street parking for three or more automobiles shall have individual spaces marked and shall be so designed, maintained and regulated that no maneuvering incidental to parking shall be on any public or private street or walk and so that any automobile may be parked or unparked without moving another.

*Shall; may*. The word "shall" is mandatory; the word "may" is permissive.

*Sign* means any device designed to inform or catch the attention of persons not on the premises on which the sign is located. For the purpose of this chapter the following devices are not considered to be signs and are not restricted:

- (1) Signs not exceeding one square foot in area and bearing only house numbers, post box numbers, names of residents of premises or other identification of premises not having commercial connotations.
- (2) Flags and insignia of any government except when displayed in connection with commercial promotion.
- (3) Legal notices, identification, informational or directional signs erected or required by governmental bodies.
- (4) Integral decorative or architectural features of buildings except letters, trademarks, moving parts or moving lights.
- (5) Signs directing, guiding or controlling traffic and parking.

*Sign, off-site*, means a sign other than an on-site sign.


