By inserting in Section 70-387, which section relates to handicapped parking, in proper alphabetical order the following:

- Chase Street, north side, starting at a point 586 feet east of Bay Street, for a distance of 20 feet easterly
- County Street, north side, starting at a point 90 feet west of Roccliffe Street, for a distance of 20 feet westerly
- Flint Street, west side, starting at a point 208 feet north of Pleasant Street, for a distance of 20 feet northerly
- Hamlet Street, north side, starting at a point 21 feet east of Melville Street, for a distance of 20 feet easterly

- Washington Street, west side, starting at a point 143 feet north of Hope Street, for a distance of 20 feet northerly





RE: Mooring Fees Revolving Fund

Councilors:

As part of the newly enacted Municipal Modernization Act, effective Nov 7, 2016, Revolving Funds subject to MGL 44 sec 53 1/2 must now be authorized by ordinance.

The revolving fund ordinance must include the following:

1. the program or activity for which the revolving fund may be expended
2. the departmental receipts (which can include any fees, charges or other departmental receipts) in connection with those programs or activities that shall be credited to the fund
3. the board, department or municipal official authorized to expend from the fund

As a result of this new State legislation, it is appropriate that the Finance Agenda item for the establishment of this Fund be referred to the Committee on Ordinances for review and recommendation. The Administration will be drafting the Ordinance for review by the Ordinance Committee. Should you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact me.

Your vote to refer this Finance item #2 to the Ordinance Committee is respectfully requested.

Article XI. REVOLVING FUNDS


Section 2.

2-1040 Mooring Fees Revolving Fund

The purpose of this revolving fund is to meet, in whole or in part, expenses relating to the upkeep and maintenance of city owned moorings. The account shall be funded by the mooring rental receipts. The fund will be utilized by the Harbor Master under the supervision of the Police Department. The fund shall be held in and appropriated from in manner provided in Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 53, Section E ½.


